Brenda Davidson currently serves as Vice President, PAC-3® Programs at Lockheed Martin Missiles and Fire Control (MFC). Brenda is responsible for establishing strategy, direction and execution oversight for the full product life cycle of all domestic and international PAC-3 products, including the PAC-3 Cost Reduction Initiative (CRI) and Missile Segment Enhancement (MSE) interceptors and associated ground launch equipment.

Prior to her current role, Brenda served as Director and Deputy Program Manager for Upper Tier Integrated Air and Missile Defense (UTIAMD) at Lockheed Martin MFC. Her responsibilities included supporting the Vice President with the overall execution and strategic growth of MFC's Upper Tier Programs, including Terminal High Altitude Area Defense (THAAD) system, a key element to the Ballistic Missile Defense System. From 2010 to 2017, she was Program Director for the PAC-3 Production Programs. In this capacity, she significantly increased the missile and launcher modification production rates to meet the growing demand of the U.S. Government and international customers. She led the production team through the transition into production of the PAC-3 MSE. Her outstanding leadership resulted in MFC being recognized as a finalist in the Aviation Week Program Excellence Awards.

Brenda's career spans over 30 years with Lockheed Martin where she has held positions of increasing responsibility at MFC and Aeronautics, bringing a diversified knowledge in program management, accounting, auditing government contracting regulations, contracts, financial management and strategic planning.

Brenda holds a bachelor's degree in Business Administration in Accounting from West Texas A&M University and a Master of Science in Management from Southern Methodist University. She is a Board-Certified Public Accountant and Certified Professional Contracting Manager. Brenda received the Honorable Order of Saint Barbara award for her contribution to the Artillery branch in 2016.
